

# MCKINLEY PRESCHOOL

- Supports and nurtures the growth of the whole child

- Classrooms are designed to bring typically developing preschoolers and those with special needs together to learn and grow

Our preschool curriculum is aligned with the District's elementary academic program. McKinley uses the *OWL, Opening the World of Learning, Curriculum* for overall development, and *Second Step* for social skills. McKinley Preschool uses the *Desired Results Developmental Profile (DRDP)* as the building wide assessment. The children will do activities together under the direction of a licensed Early Childhood teacher.

Children who are 3 or 4 years old by Sept 1, 2018 are eligible for preschool.

All applications require a \$25.00 **Non-Refundable** fee regardless of income status.



- **PreK** programs will offer 3, 4 and 5 day programming, most classes are 2.5 hours, some in the morning and some in the afternoon for those children who will be attending Kindergarten the following fall. McKinley Preschool focuses on building skills the children will need to be successful in Kindergarten.
- **ALL DAY PROGRAM** offers 6.5 hours of preschool programming for children attending Kindergarten the following fall, with a licensed teacher.

This class includes wrap around day care services from 7:00-8:45 and 3:15-5:30 by McKinley Munchkins through Kids World.

- **3 / 4 Combo** class will be offered for children turning 4 **between** the dates of 6/1/18 and 12/1/18. It will build kindergarten readiness skills children need to participate the following year in the PreK classroom or Kindergarten.
- **3 Year Old** class will work to help students learn how to follow a classroom routine, introduce letters and numbers, and build socialization skills.

**A \$25 Non-Refundable registration fee is required to process your application regardless of income status.**

For families in need of financial assistance, there is a scholarship process. All applications will be considered with assistance and classroom placement being provided to the families with the most need. You will be notified if your child is placed in a classroom and what the fee will be. A sliding scale will be used to determine payments. There may be opportunities for families to qualify for scholarships through the state of Minnesota's Parent Aware Program. Those families will be identified through the same process.

**FOR REGISTRATION PLEASE BRING:**

Birth Certificate and Proof of Income if applying for scholarship.

**PLEASE NOTE:** As of September 1, 2014 Minnesota State Law requires that all children in an early childhood program through pre-kindergarten be up to date on their immunizations in order for them to remain in school. The DTaP, polio, MMR, chicken pox, pneumococcal, Hib, and Hepatitis A and B shots are required for child care and early childhood programs.

The only children who are not required to be immunized are those who have medical reasons for not receiving certain shots or who are legally exempt because of their parents' personal beliefs. A statement signed by a physician stating that the immunization is contra-indicated for medical exemption. A notarized statement signed by the student's parent or legal guardian stating that the prescribed immunizations are contrary to conscientiously held beliefs of the parent or guardian. **The child care or early childhood program provider will refuse to admit your child if he or she doesn't have documentation of either the shots or a legal exemption.**

EARLY CHILDHOOD SPECIAL EDUCATION**

Faribault Public School's concern for children doesn't begin in kindergarten and end at graduation. Our teachers are on hand to work with children who need additional developmental and educational help from birth through age 21. The program that is designed to meet the developmental needs of our youngest learners is the Early Childhood Special Education Program (ECSE).

**Eligible children are those with developmental delays or with a certain diagnosed physical or mental condition or disorder that results in a delay.**

**Infant and Toddler Intervention** provides special services and supports for eligible children birth through age two and their families. Eligible children are those with developmental delays or with a certain diagnosed physical or mental condition or disorder that results in a delay.

**Preschool Special Education** is for children from age three until they begin kindergarten with developmental delays or other disabilities, and who are experiencing challenges in their learning and development.

**Early Intervention**

Early Intervention services for children birth to three years old are provided within the child's natural environments. These "Routines-Based Interventions" are based on the child's daily likes and are guided by your family's priorities. ECSE teachers will provide coaching to parents and caregivers to help promote a child's development. Families are coached in strategies to help improve developmental areas such as cognition and communication, as well as social, motor, and self-help skills.

**Preschool Special Education**

Our program strives to help young children interact successfully with friends and family at home, in the community, and at school. To achieve this goal, the ECSE staff work as partners with the parents and teachers. Faribault Public Schools provides a continuum of special education and related services depending on each student's unique special education needs and the goals determined by the student's Individual Education Plan (IEP). Services are provided in the least restrictive environment which is appropriate for the individual student.
